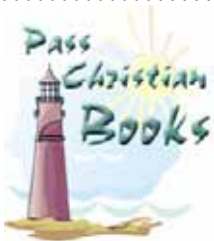

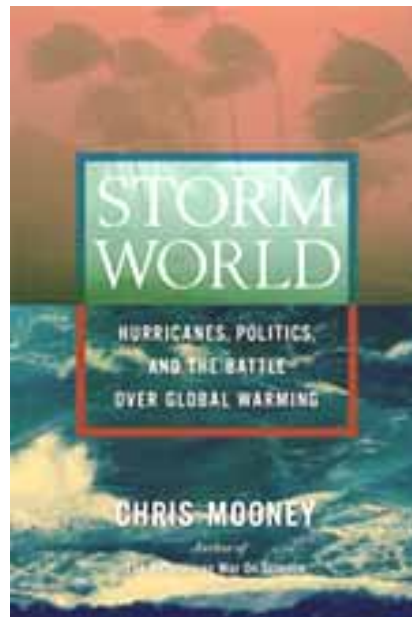

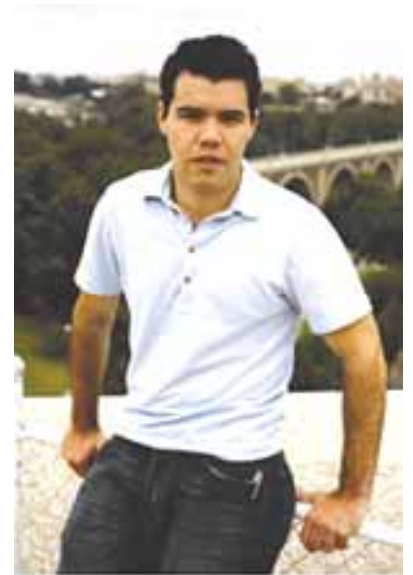

One of the leading science journalists and commentators working today, Mooney delves into a red-hot debate in meteorology: whether the increasing ferocity of hurri-

canes is connected to global warming.

In the wake of Katrina, Mooney follows the careers of leading scientists on either side of the argument through the 2006 hurricane season, tracing how the media, special interests, politics, and the weather itself have skewed and amplified what was already a fraught scientific dispute. As Mooney puts it: "Scientists, like hurricanes, do extraordinary things at high wind speeds."

Mooney—a native of New Orleans—has written a fascinating and nuanced book on one of the most urgently compelling offshoots of the global warming debate: are we responsible for making hurricanes even bigger monsters than they already are?



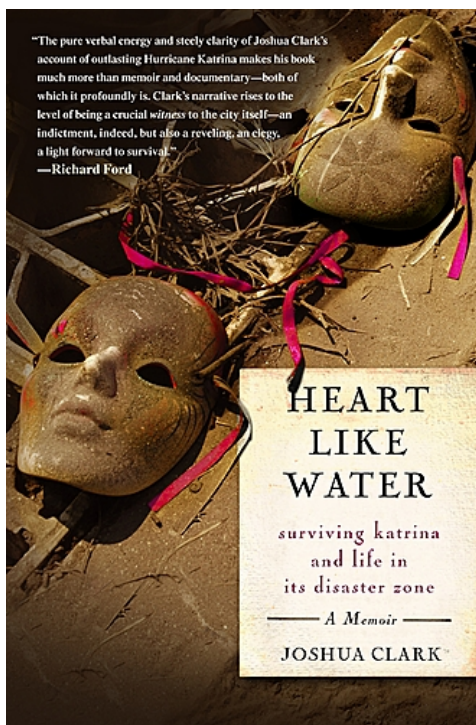

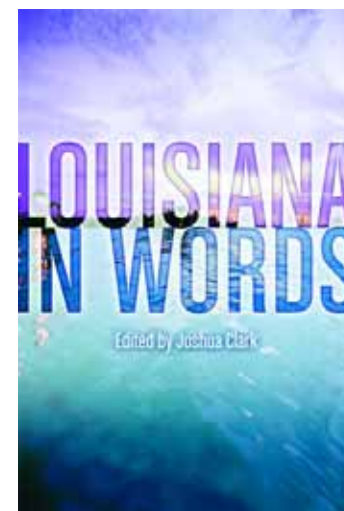

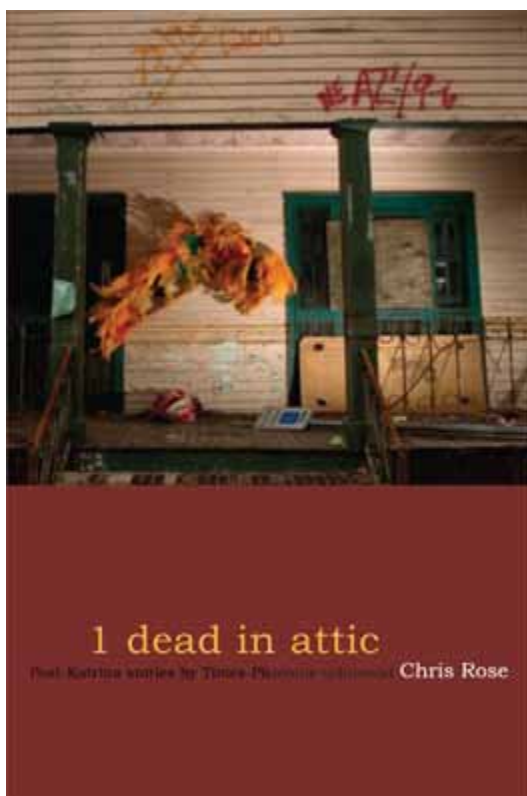
**Joshua Clark signs

"1 Dead in Attic: Post-Katrina Stories

"ONE DEAD IN ATTIC" is a collection of Rose's Pulitzer Prize-winning essays that appeared in the Times-Picayune in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. His first essay, Dear America, was written mere days after the disaster and quickly became a means of self-definition for displaced New Orleans residents. Rose continued his column throughout the recovery and rebuilding of the city in the months that followed. He chronicled the lives of those residents that had remained and struggled among the ruins of their former lives.

When it was first released in 2006, "1 Dead in Attic" became a self-publishing sensation, selling over 60,000 copies in the Gulf Coast region alone. The book includes the original text along with the subsequent year's struggle to resurrect the Crescent City.

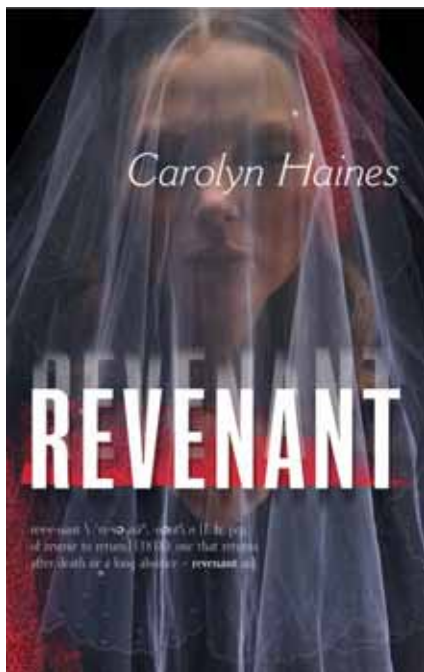
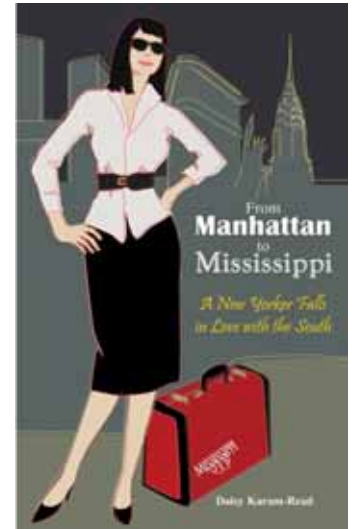

“Revenant”**

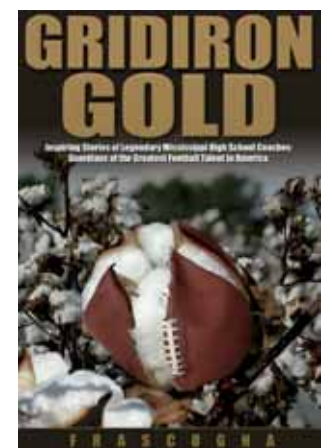
